P M Hubbard was educated at Oxford, where he won the Newdigate Prize for English Verse in 1933. From 1934 to 1947 he served in the Indian Civil Service and upon its disbandment returned to England to work for the British Council in London. In 1951 he resigned to freelance as a writer. Later he was employed as deputy director of an industrial organization, but again resigned to earn his living writing. He died in March 1980.
