### Director

Selina Cartmell is Artistic Director and Co-Chief Executive at the Royal Exchange Theatre, Manchester.

Selina took a First in Drama and History of Art from Trinity College, Dublin and Glasgow University and graduated with an MA (Distinction) from Central School of Speech and Drama in Advanced Theatre Directing. In 2007 she was protégé to Julie Taymor as part of the Rolex Mentor and Protégé Arts Initiative and Artist-In-Residence at the Samuel Beckett Theatre between 2010 and 2011. From 2016 to 2022 she was Artistic Director of the Gate Theatre, Dublin.
