### Writer

Toby has been nominated for the RTS Award for Best Soap and Continuing Drama, and several times for the Writers' Guild Awards for Best Long Running TV Series. Toby won the Best Long Running TV Series WGGG Awards in 2023 for his DOCTORS episode 'HELLO?'. He is currently part of the BBC STUDIOS Spotlight Scheme, under which he has written an original pilot.



Toby is a core writer for CASUALTY (BBC), having written 12 episodes on the show. At the 2024 BAFTA TV Awards, Casualty won best Soap & Continuing Drama having submitted Toby's episode KEEP BREATHING and his episode 'SAME OLD, SAME OLD' was nominated for a BAFTA in 2022. He was a core writer on BBC flagship drama DOCTORS, having written over 65 episodes including a number of standalone episodes, namely - the 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Episode hour long special 'A DAY AT THE MILL' and the covid special 'CAN YOU HEAR ME?' shot during lockdown by the cast on iPhones.

Toby is now part of the BBC Studios Spotlight Scheme where he is developing a new project.

As an actor, Toby has appeared in theatre productions, TV shows and films.
