She trained as a teacher at Westminster College of Education, Oxford and taught in primary schools in London. She became Arts and Reviews editor for *Contact*, the Inner London Education Authority magazine, and continued to teach part-time before becoming a freelance writer in 1986. She was television critic for *The Spectator* magazine until 1990. She is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Literature and lives in Winchester.
