Nick is a writer from Kilkenny, Ireland. He co-wrote the critically acclaimed comedy series, MOONE BOY, with Chris O'Dowd. They made three seasons together. The show won an International Emmy for Best Comedy, was Number 1 on the Hollywood Reporter's Best Comedies of 2013, and in 2020 was named Number 17 in the New York Times' list of Best International TV Shows of the



Decade. It also won three IFTA awards, the British Comedy Award for Best Sitcom, and was nominated for a BAFTA for Best Scripted Comedy.
